Computer Login

(For on-campus computers)

Your username is your last name and the last 4 digits of your Student ID (Example: doe1234)

Your password is EaccMMDDYY where "MM" is your birth month, "DD" is your birth date, and "YY" is the year of your birth. (Example: Eacc081198)

Passwords are case-sensitive. Make sure the E in Eacc is uppercase.

myEACC

Go to www.eacc.edu. At the top, left of the page, select the myEACC link.

Your username is your last name followed by the last 4 digits of your student ID.

You will set your own password. You will receive an email containing a link at which you can set your myEACC password.

If you forget your password, you can use the "I forgot my password" link on the myEACC sign-in page. Use your EACC email address when asked for an email address.



Email Login

Once logged in to myEACC, in the Quick Links section on the left, select EACC Email.

Example: Suzie Doe is a new student, logging in to EACC email for the first time. Her student ID number is 1234567. Her birthday is August 11th, 1998. She logs in using the following credentials:

Find Your Grades and Unofficial Transcript

Log in to your myEACC portal.

Click on the "Students" tab at the top of the page.

COURSE SCHEDULE:

Most students find it helpful to know in advance when and where their classes meet. If you need to see or print another copy of your class schedule, find the link on the left side of the page labeled "My Course Schedule."

GRADES:

On the right, click on "My Grade Report." (You will receive grades for midterm and the end of the semester.)

UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT:

If you want to view your unofficial transcript, on the right, you'll see a link for "My Unofficial Transcript." Follow this link to view an unofficial copy of your student transcript. This can help you better plan your degree, and keep track of your time to completion.

Click the "Students" tab at any point to return to the main student page.

Blackboard

You will need to have your EACC Student ID number handy; it will be your initial username and password. Once inside, be sure to change your password—your username will remain your ID number.







Steps to Applying for Financial Aid For classes beginning in Fall 2023:

1. To apply for financial aid, you MUST create an FSA ID. Go to https://studentaid.gov/.

Be sure to use an accessible email address NOT your high-school email

- 2. Once you have created an FSA ID, fill out 2023-2024 FAFSA at https://studentaid.gov/
 - a.) Click login or create a FAFSA. You will need your 2021 income tax information.
 - b.) Enter your FSA ID to login information.

- **For Arkansas Residents-go to scholarships.ADHE.edu and fill out the YOUNIVERSAL application for state grants and scholarships. This is the website for all state grants and the lottery funded scholarships (Academic Challenge). You will need to create an account when you finish searching for aid. If you already have an account with ADHE, please check your account on a regular basis. This website will be used by the state to communicate with you regarding any state aid. They will contact you via e-mail. Check your e-mail periodically.
- 3. There is a scholarship link on our website that lists all of <u>EACC's scholarships</u>. You can read through the requirements for each to see which ones you are eligible to apply for. You can print applications for the ones that you wish to apply for. Make sure you turn them in to the correct department (listed on each application). **Pay close attention to the application deadlines!**
- 4. **EACC's financial aid office sends all information via email, so read and respond to emails regularly**. You will be assigned an EACC email address (lastname&last four digits of ID number@eacc.edu) that you need to check as well.
- 5. Access NetPartner here or at https://netpartner.eacc.edu/NetPartner/NetPartnerStudent/Logon.aspx to monitor the status of your financial aid application, view a list of documents that we have received and those that are still outstanding, and review and accept your financial aid awards. Use your Social Security Number and choose "First Time User" to create your Password. - 6. You <u>may</u> be required to fill out an IVF (Institutional Verification Form) and provide a **copy** of your <u>2021 IRS Tax Return Transcript</u> and your 2021 W-2 forms (and your parent's, if you are a dependent student). You will receive an email telling you if you need to provide these.

Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship | ACST

High School Non-Traditional Students



The Arkansas Academic Challenge Program provides scholarships to Arkansas residents pursuing higher education. Funded in large part by the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery, the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship is available to students regardless of their academic status, whether just graduating from high school, currently enrolled in college, enrolling in college for the first time, or re-enrolling after a period of time out of college.

Who May Apply:

Traditional Students Students applying for the 2023-2024 academic year who are graduating from a public high school, a private or out-of-state high school, or home-school must have an ACT Superscore of at least a 19 (or an equivalent of a 19 composite on an equivalent test). Traditional students must enroll in at least 12 hours the first fall semester following high school graduation, and at least 15 hours each semester thereafter, to receive their funds that semester. They must complete at least 27 hours their first year, and at least 30 hours each year thereafter, with a 2.5 cumulative GPA. College Freshman who did not qualify for Academic Challenge Scholarship can apply as traditional students if they were enrolled as a full-time first-time freshman and completed 27 hours with a 2.5 GPA at the end of Spring. If they do not have 27 hours at the end of spring, they can apply as non-traditional. Non-Traditional Students are defined as students who are currently in college and did not receive Challenge, as well as adults who have completed some college but do not have a degree.

Non-traditional students with college hours will qualify with a cumulative college GPA of at least 2.5. Adults with no college can qualify for the Academic Challenge Scholarship if they have an ACT of 19 (or an equivalent score on an equivalent test) or 2.5 high school GPA if a graduate of an Arkansas public high school. Non-traditional students may enroll in as few as six hours and still receive a pro-rated scholarship amount. They must also maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5, and their continuing eligibility requirement is related to their semester enrollment.

Arkansas Future Grant | ARFUTURE

High School Non-Traditional Students Other



Arkansas Future (ArFuture) is the newest state grant program. The purpose of this grant is to increase the education and skills of Arkansas's workforce in an affordable manner. The grant applies to students enrolled in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) or regional high-demand areas of study. The grant will cover tuition and fees for qualifying certificate and Associate degree programs at Arkansas' public institutions for eligible students. The grant is available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Who May Apply: Every person who has graduated from an Arkansas high school, Arkansas home school or GED program, or anyone who has a high school diploma and has lived in Arkansas for the last three years and has not yet earned an Associate degree. Students must enroll in a STEM program, a state high demand, or regionally high demand area of study. Students must complete the FAFSA. Arkansas Workforce Challenge | AWC



Important Note: The following information is intended as a general overview of the program for those applying, or who are considering applying, for the scholarship and is not intended to be a comprehensive compilation of program requirements. For complete information, please refer to the program's rules and regulations.

The purpose of the scholarship is for workforce training in high-demand areas of healthcare, information technology, and industry. Classes are not limited to credit-bearing programs. Non-credit, workforce-training classes that fit into the three above categories may also qualify.

Who May Apply: Every person who has graduated from an Arkansas high school, Arkansas home school or GED program, or anyone who has a high school diploma or GED earned from another state and has lived in Arkansas for the last year. Students must enroll in a high demand area of study in the programs of Information Technology, Healthcare, and Industry. Programs are not restricted for credit bearing classes. Non-credit, workforce-training classes that fit into the three above categories may also qualify. A listing of programs is available on the state financial aid website: Arkansas Workforce Challenge Program List. Students are not eligible for both Academic Challenge and Workforce Challenge.

How to apply:

30 days prior to class start date

Award Amount: Up to \$800 per program

Arkansas Concurrent Challenge | CCS

High School



Qualified high school students may be eligible to enroll in concurrent courses and be covered by the new Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship.

Requirements

Qualified high school students may be eligible to enroll in concurrent courses and be covered by the new Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Act (Act 456 of 2019). The scholarship is funded by excess Arkansas Lottery proceeds.

The Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship will award eligible high school students \$125 per course for up to two concurrent credit courses per semester.

Award Amount:

\$125 per eligible course

Basic Eligibility Requirements:


- Be a high school student, classified as a junior or senior
- Be an Arkansas resident or, if the student is less than twenty-one (21) years of age, either the student or one (1) parent of the student is an Arkansas resident
- Be enrolled in an endorsed concurrent course or certificate program
- Provide proof that a completed student success plan has been submitted to the student's high school or home school. The plan must:
 - Be prepared in consultation with school personnel, the student, and the student's parent or legal guardian or a college advisor.
 - Include an endorsed concurrent enrollment course or certificate program that is relevant to the student's success plan and include measures that ensure the successful completion of the endorsed concurrent enrollment course or certificate program in 3 which the student is enrolled.
- Not enrolled in a vocational center where the student's enrollment is reimbursable under § 6-51-305
- Meet all established requirements for endorsed concurrent enrollment courses set by the Division of Higher Education

Continuing Eligibility Criteria

- A student is eligible to continue to receive the scholarship if the student successfully completes an endorsed concurrent credit course or certificate program course and receives a minimum grade point average of 2.50.
- A student who fails to complete an endorsed concurrent credit course or certificate
 program course with a minimum GPA of 2.50 may retain eligibility and enroll in no more
 than one (1) concurrent credit course or certificate program course for the semester
 immediately following the semester in which the student failed to successfully complete
 an endorsed concurrent credit course or certificate program course.
 - If a student fails to complete an endorsed concurrent credit course or certificate program course a second time, the student shall be ineligible to reapply or receive the scholarship again. This also applies to a student that drops out of an endorsed concurrent credit course or certificate program course before the end of the semester.

Other Information

Only high school students who are classified as a Junior or Senior can qualify. Contact your high school counselor or local college advisor for student and course eligibility.


